

# ARREST: Probe initiated in 2012

phy using the programs. Waterbury Detective Peter Morgan, a police computer crimes investigator, traced the computer to the home on Oakland Avenue where O'Bryan was living.

Police seized numerous machines and hard drives from the home, finding about 340 videos and images of child porn, according to an arrest warrant obtained Friday. Some of the recordings were only seconds long, while others went on for a half-hour or more, the warrant shows.

O'Bryan's story to police changed several times as to how the child porn wound up on the machines. He told police he runs a business called O'Bryan Networking and had many computers at his home that he was either fixing for people, or that had been given to him by customers.

Police identified a laptop computer that held some of the porn, which they sus-

pected he was using as a personal computer. O'Bryan told police that it had come from a "neighborhood kid," but later said it was actually part of a Milford radio station he operated called Slap House Radio.

Another man at the station had downloaded things onto his laptop and had remote access to it, he told police. But police found child porn on other devices that were seized from the home and at least one of the computers was used to back up O'Byran's iPhone, according to the warrant.

It's unclear when O'Bryan moved out of the city.

O'Bryan, who doesn't have a criminal record, was released on a \$150,000 bond following his arraignment in Waterbury Superior Court. He was ordered not to use any computers, or have unsupervised contact with children younger than 18.
