**STORRS** — Dr. Agisilaos John "Pappy" Pappanikou, professor emeritus of educational psychology, and pioneer and champion in the field of developmental disabilities, died peacefully at his home on Friday, Nov. 6, 2009. He was predeceased by his wife of 55 years, Lucette Nadeau Pappanikou.  
 Pappy was born to John Evangelo and Demetra (Karagiannis) Pappanikou in Grevna, Greece, in 1930, where he lived until the age of 7 when his family moved to Augusta, Maine. He attended Bowdoin College and graduated with an AB in economics and biology. He received his master's degree in 1957 and his doctorate in 1962 from Syracuse University.

Pappy was a staunch supporter of UConn athletics and believed that his affiliation with the athletic programs at UConn, from women's soccer to men's hockey, provided him the opportunity to develop his deepest and most meaningful friendships.

He leaves his children, Anne Druzolowski and her husband, Joseph, of South Windsor, Sandra Sutyla and her husband, Raymond, of Ellington, John Pappanikou and his wife, Carol, of Waterbury, Elayne Marrotte and her husband, John, of Windham; and nine grandchildren, Christopher, John Jr., Meghan, Sarah, Alissa, Nicholas, Lindsey, Alexander and Tyler. **ARRESTS: Teenager among suspects caught in porn raids**

age. Police say the pictures and videos found on the machines showed children and teenagers engaged in sex. Computers from the seven homes were confiscated during the raid and are being examined by authorities.

Additional charges could be filed by police and additional arrests could be made based on the evidence investigators recover from the machines, police said. Detective Peter Morgan and officer Michael Chance led the investigation for the city, developing the case throughout October.

The information that led local investigators to identify the computers stems from a program developed by an FBI agent assigned to the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force. The program is capable of scanning computers using the file-sharing software Lime Wire, which is a free program

commonly used to swap music and video files, sometimes illegally. When a person is using the software and is connected to the Internet, it can open their computer files to other users around the world. Authorities took advantage of that access to scan computers that potentially held child

pornography. Since February, 12 people in Waterbury and Watertown have been arrested by police tracking Lime Wire use, and the number is expected to grow. Lopez, Rosa and the teenager arrested Tuesday are expected to appear in Waterbury Superior Court today.
